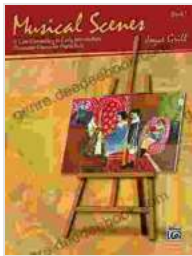


11 Late Elementary to Early Intermediate Character Pieces for Solo Piano

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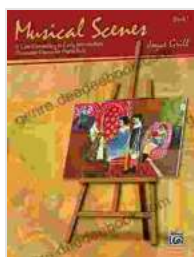
