Early Life and Education

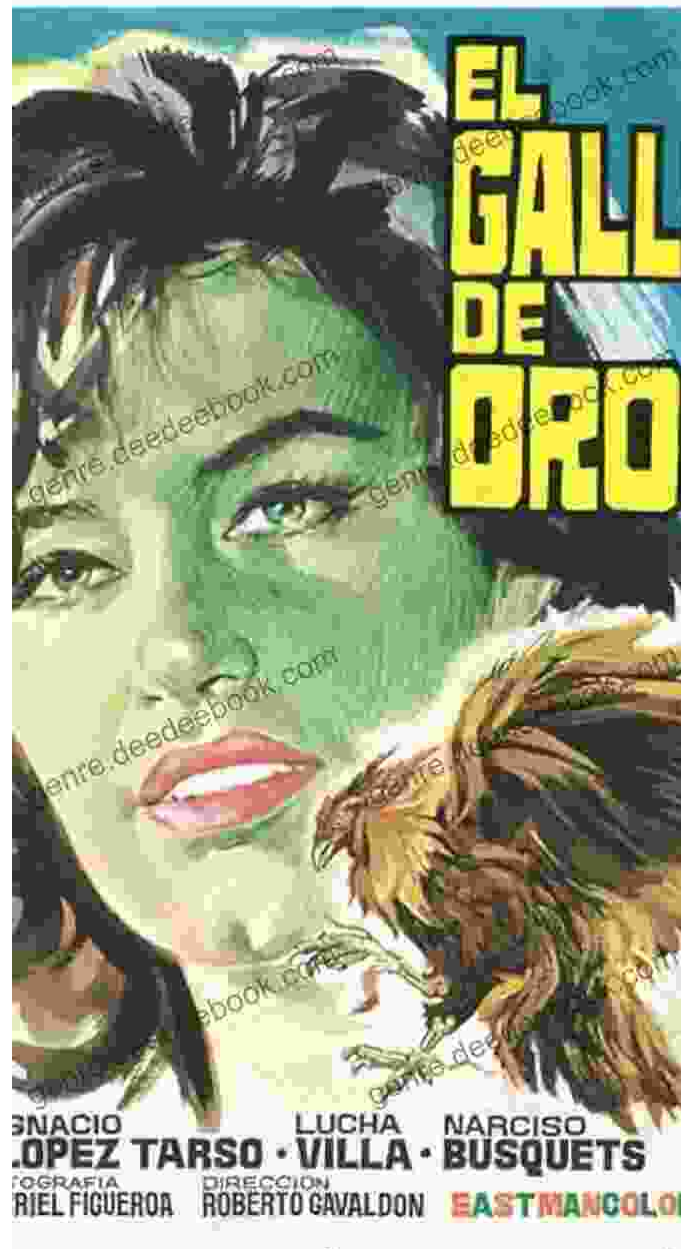

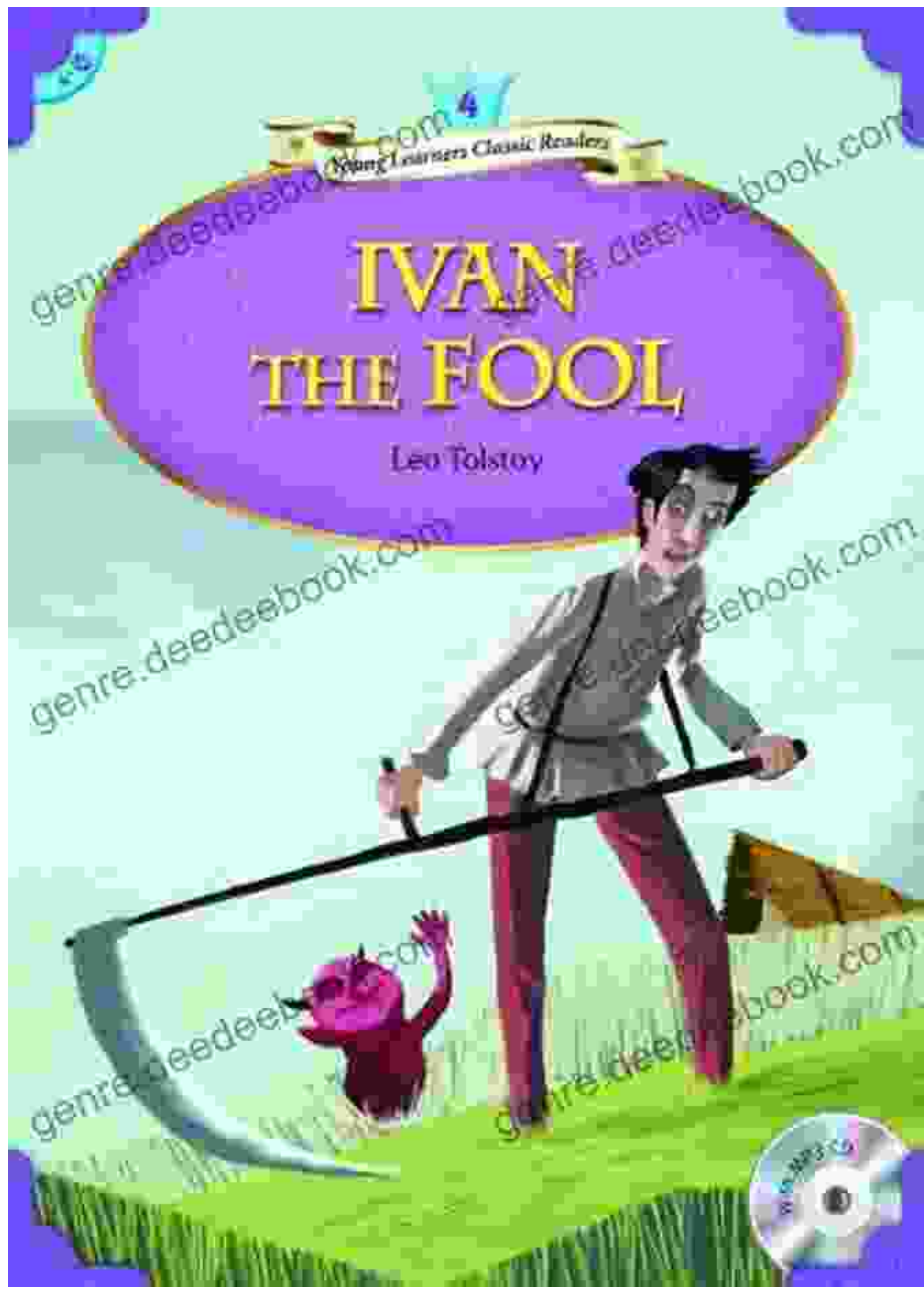

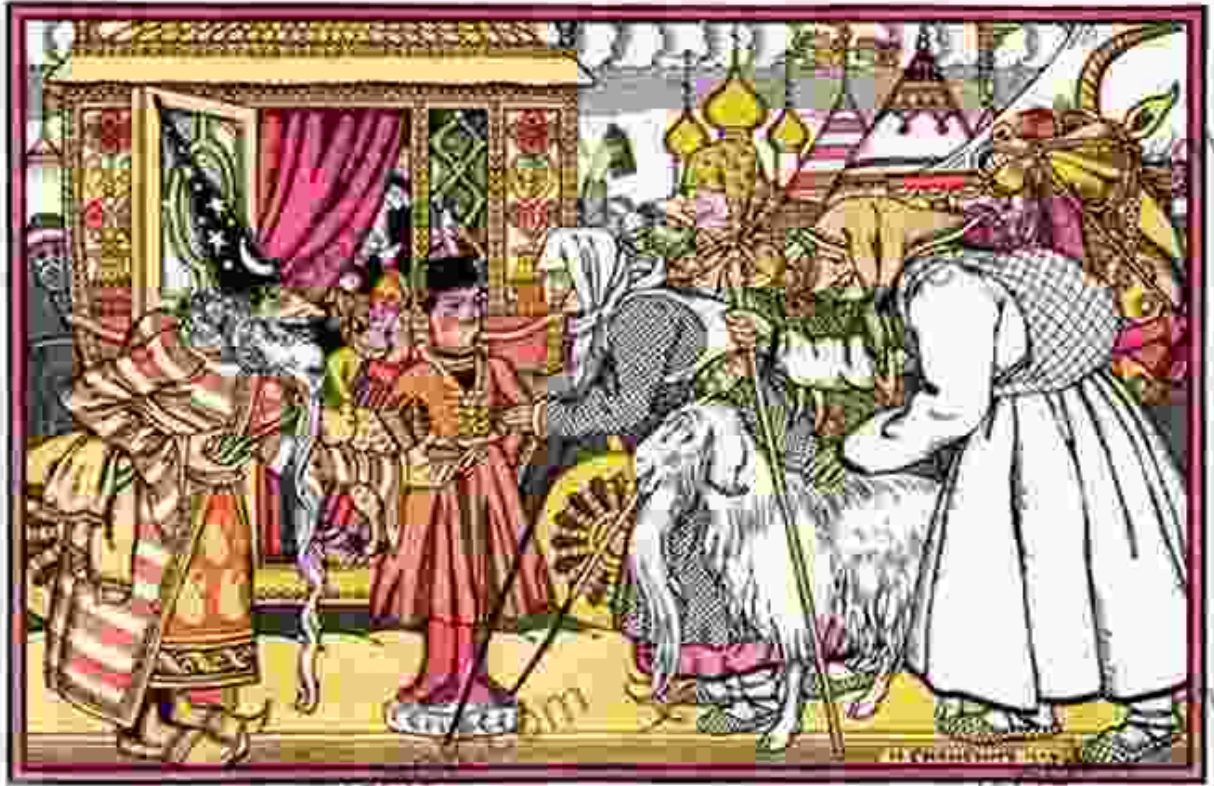
