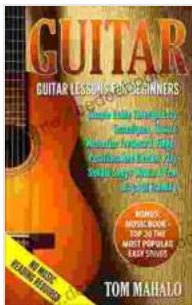

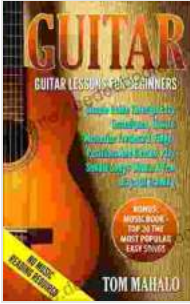
- C major chord
