

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Materials You'll Need:

- Yarn of your choice (worsted weight or DK weight recommended for beginners)
- Crochet hook (size H/8 or 5 mm recommended)
- Scissors

- Optional: Yarn needle for weaving in ends

The Basic Stitches:

1. Single Crochet (sc)

The foundation of all crochet, sc creates a dense and durable fabric.



- a. Insert the hook into the next stitch.

- b. Yarn over and pull up a loop.
- c. Yarn over and pull through both loops on the hook.

2. Half Double Crochet (hdc)

A taller stitch than sc, hdc adds texture and drape to your projects.



- a. Yarn over and insert the hook into the next stitch.
- b. Yarn over and pull up a loop.
- c. Yarn over and pull through two loops on the hook.
- d. Yarn over and pull through the remaining two loops on the hook.

3. Double Crochet (dc)

The tallest of the basic stitches, dc creates a more open and airy fabric.




- a. Yarn over and insert the hook into the next stitch.
- b. Yarn over and pull up a loop.

- c. Yarn over and pull through two loops on the hook.
- d. Yarn over and pull through two loops on the hook.
- e. Yarn over and pull through the remaining two loops on the hook.

The Cute Stitches:

4. Treble Crochet (tr)

A taller and more textured version of dc, tr creates stunning lace patterns.



- a. Yarn over and insert the hook into the next stitch.
- b. Yarn over and pull up a loop.
- c. Yarn over and pull through two loops on the hook.
- d. Yarn over and pull through two loops on the hook.

- e. Yarn over and pull through two loops on the hook.
- f. Yarn over and pull through the remaining two loops on the hook.

5. Double Treble Crochet (dtr)

A tall and airy stitch, dtr creates delicate and lacy fabrics.



- a. Yarn over and insert the hook into the next stitch.
- b. Yarn over and pull up a loop.
- c. Yarn over and pull through two loops on the hook.

- d. Yarn over and pull through two loops on the hook.
- e. Yarn over and pull through two loops on the hook.
- f. Yarn over and pull through two loops on the hook.
- g. Yarn over and pull through the remaining two loops on the hook.

6. **Popcorn Stitch**

A playful and textured stitch, popcorn adds a unique dimension to your work.



- a. Make 5 dc into the next stitch.
- b. Slip stitch (sl st) into the top of the first dc.

7. V-Stitch

A versatile and elegant stitch, v-stitch creates a lacy and openwork fabric.



- a. Make 3 dc into the next stitch.
- b. Ch 1 and make 3 dc into the same stitch.

8. Cluster Stitch


A bulky and textured stitch, cluster stitch adds a touch of whimsy to your projects.



- a. Make 3 dc into the next stitch.
- b. Make 2 dc into the same stitch.
- c. Make 1 dc into the same stitch.

9. Bobble Stitch

A fun and playful stitch, bobble stitch creates adorable puff-like embellishments.



- a. Make 4 dc into the next stitch.
 - b. Yarn over and pull through all four loops on the hook.
 - c. Repeat step 2 four more times.
 - d. Slip stitch into the first dc of the group.

Creating Your First Project:

Now that you have mastered these adorable stitches, let's put them to use and create a simple yet charming project.

Materials:

- Yarn of your choice (worsted weight or DK weight recommended)
- Crochet hook (size H/8 or 5 mm recommended)
- Scissors
- Yarn needle for weaving in ends

Step 1: Choose a Stitch

Select one of the stitches you learned today to create your project. For beginners, we recommend starting with single crochet or half double crochet.

Step 2: Chain Stitches

To start your project, make a chain of stitches. The length of the chain will determine the width of your project.

Step 3: Work in the Stitches


Once you have your chain, begin working in the stitches. Use the stitch you selected to create rows of stitches, working across the chain.

Step 4: Finish Off

Once you have reached the desired length, finish off your project by cutting the yarn and weaving in the ends.

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
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
